Affective Meaning Positive emotions focus on themes of love, commitment, and Positive Meaning certainty, while negative emotions reflect dependence and longing. Negative Meaning These findings demonstrate the power of carefully chosen words in Lyrics Analysis shaping the emotional experience of the listener and the relationship between the singer and the audience. There are different types of meanings, such as lexical meaning (the meaning of individual words), compositional meaning (how meanings combine in phrases or sentences), and pragmatic meaning (how context influences interpretation). Understanding semantics is crucial for studying how people communicate to each other, how language reflects thought, and how does meaning affect in everyday interactions.

Affective meaning refers to the emotional response that arises in the listener or reader due to the specific choice of words orphrases used in a piece of language. [9] affective meaning is the interplay of three meaning dimensions: evaluation, potency, and activity, which can be learnt through stimulus pairing and exposure.. This type of meaning is influenced by the emotional state or mood the language evokes in the audience, rather than just its literal meaning. [10] emotives are words associated with one of the emotions and are used in public and private settings by different genders and ages. For instance, in the context of sad songs, the songwriter may intentionally select words with negative connotations, such as "separation," "loss," and "longing." These words are often associated with emotional pain, sadness, and heartache, and their use aims to evoke similar emotions in the listener. The emotional atmosphere of the song is shaped by the underlying affective meaning that these words bring to the forefront. On the other hand, in happy songs, the songwriter typically uses positive, uplifting words like "love," "hope," and "victory." These words are linked to emotions such as joy, optimism, and fulfillment, and their presence helps create a more cheerful and encouraging emotional tone in the song. Thus, affective meaning plays a critical role in how language can convey emotions and how the choice of specific words can directly influence the emotional experience of the listener or reader. The use of such words often brings about feelings of sorrow, disappointment, or discomfort. In contexts such as sad songs or lamentations, these words help to reflect the struggles or emotional pain experienced by the speaker or character, and they prompt similar emotional responses from the audience. Thus, understanding both positive and negative affective meanings allows us to appreciate how language functions not just to convey information, but to evoke and communicate complex emotional experiences.

After exploring the concept of affective meaning, which refers to the emotional responses by specific words or phrases, it becomes evident how language can convey powerful emotions, such as happiness, love, or sadness, through carefully chosen vocabulary. This connection between language and emotion is particularly significant when analyzing song lyrics, as songs often use words and phrases to evoke strong feelings in listeners. A prime example of a song that effectively utilizes affective meaning is "Nothing Gonna Change My Love for You." In both cases, understanding affective meaning provides insight into how language can influence emotional responses, offering a deeper understanding of communication's power to evoke feelings in diverse contexts.

2. Research Method

2.3. Data Collection

The data collection process for this research focuses on the song as the primary source, with the lyrics obtained from lyricfind.com, a reliable platform for accurate and copyright-compliant song lyrics. These lyrics serve as the foundation for analyzing affective meaning and emotional resonance in the song. Additionally, the researcher conducted a literature review of similar studies published from [11], and [17] to provide theoretical support and context. This dual approach, combining primary data from the song and insights from related studies.

2.4. Data Analysis

The data analysis in this research focuses on uncovering the affective meaning conveyed in the song by analyzing its lyrics. The analysis begins with an in-depth reading of the lyrics to familiarize the researcher with their content and context. Supporting this process, a review of previous research helps validate the findings and provide comparative insights into how affective meaning is communicated through lyrics. Furthermore, these findings resonate with prior studies by [11] and [17], which emphasized the influence of linguistic affect on emotional experience and audience reception. By discussing these results in light of existing theories and empirical evidence, this section aims to deepen the understanding of how language in song lyrics shapes and communicates complex emotional dynamics.

Positive meanings, emphasizing love, commitment, and hope, dominate the song's lyrical content, while negative meanings reflect dependency and longing. These findings align with G. Leech's theory of affective meaning and underscore the power of linguistic choices in evoking emotional responses. The results not only validate previous research on linguistic affect but also contribute to understanding how songs foster deep connections between artists and their audiences through emotional expression. This study affirms the intricate interplay between language, emotion, and music as a universal form of communication.

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
